### PONT ROYAL WELCOMES INTERNATIONAL MEDIA

Golf and travel journalists from across Europe's major golfing markets have visited Golf International Pont Royal, in Provence, in recent weeks as the resort showcased its European Challenge Tour venue and announced plans for further investment.

The European Challenge Tour, which has helped some current stars of the game, will visit Pont Royal in Provence for the first time in 2018.



# THE SOUTH

Europe's most cultivated and sun-kissed playground is also home to more than 150 golf courses, including the No.1 ranked resort in our *Golf World* Top-100.

**W**hat's it like to say that many of France's best-known courses can be found in and around Paris—or even further south—where France has enough top-quality courses and fringe benefits to attract even the most discerning golfer. For a start, there's the climate. Blessed with warm sunshiny days (a heat wave) and the prime golf season in the south stretches from late April until early October. Then there's the cuisine. In this part of the world, the thrill of the golf is considerably tempered by the sumptuous post-round dining options. You can have Provençal seafood cooking (Bastide à la Provence) or a fish soup (soupe au poisson) paired with steamed leeks.

Then there's the golf course itself, the place de resistance, tapas-style—an olives dip made of black olives, capers, anchovies, garlic, and olive oil that is usually served with croutons or tortilla chips.

And finally, thank the heavens, Bastide will over 150 courses; a single user will only scratch the surface of all the region has to offer. To make a visit to the south more manageable, our advice is to divide it into three distinct regions: Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur; Rhône-Alpes; and Midi Pyrénées-Languedoc-Roussillon.

**Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur**

If you're a frequent reader of *Golf World*, you'll know there are significant differences between the golf courses listed in our Top-100 Courses section and those in our Top-100 Resorts ranking. In this instance, a great resort golf course won't cut it in our rankings; nor focus solely on the quality of the golf course. There are exceptions to the rule, of course, and it's not so happenstance that one of them can be found at the south-east corner of France.

Tour Blanche is No.1 in our Top 100 Resorts Continental Europe ranking. Its 18-hole course, the Chateau, is also ranked 14th in our Top 100 Courses Continental Europe ranking. Nestled in unspoiled lush nature, the resort combines five-star accommodation with Michelin-star dining and world-class golf. The resort is part of the prestigious European Tour Provençal portfolio, which gives it access to a wide range of concierge services from expert caddies. As a result, it's always extremely popular. "Tour Blanche is like an oasis in the arid, dry Mediterranean region," says golf course designer Dominique Hepp. "An oasis where everything grows."

The resort houses two Dan Thomas-designed championship courses, both of which blend seamlessly into the existing landscape. The Chateau is the easier challenge, and, as a result, is the choice for less-experienced players, while the La Bastide course is largely reserved for amateurs and pros. Aside from the excellent variety of holes, the Chateau is characterized by constantly changing water—fifteen measures to reflect the woodland in coves to lakes and streams and, of course, the famous chateau itself.

Tour Blanche may be the jewel in the crown of the region, but it's by no means the only option. In fact, there are some other courses in Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur. Take the Provençal, where world-famous courses and waters can be combined alongside stunning Mediterranean views, making golf course design look straightforward.

Whisk in the south would be fully satisfying. Pont Royal in Malaucène, near Bédoin, is one design that France has lost its way on several occasions, during the past few decades, but deserves it in the wider range of an impressive range that will set a new chapter in regional golf, the golf course design facilities and challenges.

The major attraction at Pont Royal is the views. The course looks out over the Alpilles and Luberon, Durance Valley

and the mountains of Trets. As you would expect from a Seve design there are plenty of do-or-die options and more than the occasional quirky hole—including the first, which skips seemingly from left to right and has a large tree in the middle of the fairway. The greens are quick and true, and several holes could take a claim to being the most dramatic up there. Stay on-on at the Massilia de Vaucluse hotel, not just for its restaurants, but also for its spa, bar and heated pool.

**Rhône-Alpes**

This region is home to Ecrins and its fabulously insert, built to assist Europe's trudging along more than 100 years ago. The Ecrins Resort Golf Club annually hosts the final major of the fall/winter season. Overlooking the shores of Lake Geneva and at the foot of the Alps, the course is characterized by sloping fairways, dramatic elevation changes and multi-level greens. Off the course, there are three impressive accommodation options—the exquisite five-star Royal Hotel, the elegant Ecrins and a breath-hold-and-breakfast in the centre of the academy, Le Manoir du Golf.

The mountain of the Rhône-Alps collection is headlined by the Lyon area, home to a trio of outstanding courses in Lyon GL, Gassiat and Sathonay. If you plan on venturing further afield, it's worth noting that the courses become more sparsely located and, therefore, require more careful planning to experience them. Tignes, Avoriaz, Meribel, Courchevel, Les Gets, Thye Vallée and Chamonix double up as ski resorts in the winter and golf resorts in the summer. The aprés-ski season becomes après-golf at the region's fabulous bars and restaurants.

**Midi Pyrénées-Languedoc-Roussillon**

For one, the area of land between the Atlantic and the Mediterranean in the southwest corner of France is known as Minervois. And the Cévennes mountains. Soches, the marshy Camargue and the Cévennes mountains. The region is also home to almost 40 courses, the most northerly of which is Saillat. Carried out of an old forest, its tight fairways and elevated greens demand pinpoint accuracy from the golfer. To the south, Golf Club de Toulouse is one of the prettiest golf courses featuring city and mountain views. In the south of the Massif Central, Domaine de Montirac offers golf in a 100-year-old oak forest, an on-site hotel and cottages. On the Mediterranean coast, Roquebrune Juan-les-Pins' Le Grand Motte is within walking distance of the beaches of the sandy resort that bears the same name, while Cap d'Agde is an exuberant Rioja design with a very own Azalea Course.

On the Catalan coast near Perpignan, Saint Cyprien resort boasts two courses, while on the Pyrenees, Domaine de Falga has an idyllic south-facing setting near the Spanish border. Nîmes Camargue, Nîmes Vaucluse and Golf de Caramany complete the selection of high-quality courses. ■

**» Seve Ballesteros a posé sa signature au cœur de la garrigue provençale**

« Cela sent bon la Provence ! » Comment échapper à ce cliché aux parfums si spécifiques de cette région privilégiée de la France quand on pose, le sourire aux lèvres, pieds et... clubs de golf dans le domaine de Pont Royal ?

Situé dans la commune de Mallemort, entre Aix et Avignon, à trente petites minutes des gares et aéroports d'Avignon et de Marseille, le domaine de Pont Royal, connu depuis longtemps par les Belges car s'y est créé un village Pierre&Vacances, abrite aussi, et ce depuis 1992, un parcours de golf qui ne laisse personne indifférent.
