

Sultans of Swing rock up for golfing fun at Pont Royal

Three members of the [Rock & Roll Hall of Fame](#) were Brothers in Arms at Golf International Pont Royal recently as Goodwood GC competed in a friendly annual contest against the host club in Provence.

Dire Straits' keyboardist Guy Fletcher, and John Illsley, who was a co-founder and bass player of the legendary band, were joined by world-renowned record producer and former Pont Royal member Glyn Johns, author of the best-selling *Sound Man* – a memoir of his time working with some of the world's top artists, including the Eagles, the Rolling Stones, the Who, Eric Clapton, Johnny Cash, Led Zeppelin, the Clash, and the Beatles.

But the trio failed to hit the right notes on the day as bragging rights went to the team from Pont Royal as Goodwood were forced to return home with the rather-less-than highly prized Golden Boot ... at least until the return match in West Sussex in October.

The Golden Boot contest between Pont Royal and Goodwood – a venue world-renowned for its Festival of Speed, racecourse and now as the location for the Rolls-Royce headquarters – was inaugurated by Johns and his friend and former club-mate in France David Payne, now Pont Royal's vice-president.

The teams play annually, at Pont Royal in the spring and at Goodwood in October, with the loser forced to take possession of the old, battered boot in-between times.

Payne said: "It's always a pleasure to welcome Glyn – who captains the visitors – and the rest of the team to Pont Royal. And, this year, we aging rockers were determined to get a picture of the three hall-of-famers with the golden boot, particularly as we won't get to see it again until at least October."

"I suppose you could say on this occasion they paid their money for nothing ... but their drinks were free," he smiled.

Many holes at Pont Royal are blessed with a plateau setting, offering stunning views to the Luberon and Alpilles mountain ranges. Technical shaping of shots is required to reach the true, slick greens, and visitors enjoy an interesting, wide variety of holes that form a smooth and seamless experience. It contains some tough holes – none more so than the 11th, where players face a 215-yard test across a steep rocky valley to a raised green.

Golf and travel journalists from across Europe's major golfing markets have visited Golf International Pont Royal, in Provence, in recent weeks as the resort showcased its European Challenge Tour venue and announced plans for further investment.

The Seve Ballesteros-designed course – the only one of its kind in France – opened in 1992 and was purchased by its members in 2001 as they looked to restore it to its original glory. Significant investment followed and the refurbished course and clubhouse played host to members of the media from France, Germany, Belgium, the Netherlands, Switzerland and the UK.

And first impressions proved overwhelmingly positive if the reactions of the first few journalists to look around are any indication.

Damian Bungart, editor of Germany's *GolfTime* magazine, said: "The trip to Pont Royal was a great experience. The course was in perfect shape and I really enjoyed the Seve layout, including the stunning mountain views. It's definitely a place I'd love to visit again."

Golf Monthly's content editor, David Taylor, added: "The course was in fantastic condition and presented a really good test of golf. The resort and hotel (Moulin de Vernègues) offered great food and a welcome relaxing haven away from the fairways."

A club spokesman said: "We are hugely proud of what we have achieved here at Pont Royal since the club was taken on by the members. We believe we have elevated the offering but we haven't shouted about it from the rooftops.

"We felt now was the time for us to invite members of the golfing and travel press and to say to them 'this is the new-look Pont Royal – and we welcome visitors from across the globe' – particularly at a time when we are set to host the Challenge Tour's Open De Provence by Hopps Group in September.

"We have been heartened by their positive comments which support our view that we have something special here in beautiful Provence."

PONT ROYAL IS UP FOR THE CHALLENGE OF TOUR VISIT

With less than four weeks to go until the Challenge Tour's inaugural Hopps Open de Provence, officials at the host venue, Golf International Pont Royal, are confident the venue will allow the Tour to live up to its name.

The Hopps Open de Provence takes place from September 20-23 – just a little more than a week before the Ryder Cup, in Paris – and the pros are running out of events to secure the necessary points to claim a top-15 place in the [Road to Ras Al Khaimah](#) to guarantee full playing rights to the 2019 European Tour international schedule.

Officials at Pont Royal are also under pressure as they look to ensure the Severiano Ballesteros-designed course – France's only Ballesteros design – will provide as tough a challenge as any on the Tour this season.

A club spokesman said: "The greens-staff are working overtime to ensure the course does not suffer in the heat we've been experiencing. But they're not just watering heavily, they're also fine tuning the course to provide a good test for the pros and to ensure a good spectacle for those who come along to watch."

The 'fine tuning' includes ensuring the first cut of rough, and then the rough itself, is of a consistent length and also refilling all bunkers on the course with a striking yellow sand. In addition, a new bunker has been constructed on the eighth fairway to catch out attempts to pre-empt the dog-leg.

What's more the intention is for the greens to be running at a lightning-quick 13-14 on the stimpmeter by the time the tournament tees off – the same sort of speed as the greens at Augusta National, when the Masters hits town.

More than 100 volunteers from golf clubs across Provence will take on marshalling duties for the duration of the event, as the anticipation for the visit of the Challenge Tour grows.

The spokesman added: "It's been some time since Provence hosted a professional golf event of this standing, so people are increasingly excited about it. And, as we're heading towards the end of the Road to Ras Al Khaimah we're hopeful there might be one or two well-known names in the field, as well."



SEVE'S FRENCH STAR

Pont Royal blends Ballesteros' only French course design with gastronomy, wine and relaxation to create a paradise in Provence



SEVE'S FRENCH STAR

Sitting in the foothills of the Alps in the very heart of Provence, it's no surprise that the great Seve Ballesteros chose this as one of his first designs. His only French course.

When the Spanish great came to the small town of Miramas some 20 years ago as a par-70 champion he felt the way he saw and played the game. Change, fun and strategic test and its a scenario that's largely true under 7,000 yards of par-70 courses and Pont Royal's signature track by Luberon and Vaucluse mountains.

This combination has attracted the Challenge Tour for the last 10 years. Provence by Europa Group is set to host a new event next year, 2021. That news has seen Pont Royal's members, who have spent the distance 2001, increase their average investment per course to 18 million euros in a French open destination over the last five years.

Since taking over the members have already joined with new facilities, irrigation systems, two

new driving ranges, a full golf centre, Pont Royal Academy and a 200-seat restaurant. The Academy has also created a 27-hole indoor Training Centre. Plans to extend the other course holes to 18 have been submitted to the local council, while the clubhouse will be extended with new changing rooms, pro shop and terrace. A fitness centre and spa to complement existing facilities is also planned.

During your stay here you can take on the 18-hole course, or simply dip in and out of the 18-hole holes, tucked away with a huge price in the middle of the hillside of a shadowed valley.

A testing par-3 over water follows, taking you past the river's floodbed and down the Parcours 102 yards. Moulins de Vergagnes hotel and luxury spa, situated in a villa complex, stands on a plateau that looks out over the valley. It's a dramatic place that's been built to look like a traditional Provençal manor house, the design left them time to move to carry out over a huge valley towards a meadow of lavender with little room for error. You could just

spit or a vision of the tee, but you'd choose Seve's hole to be approached.

A drive along the Parcours 4, a red plaque on each post marks the end of the most spectacular and challenging hole in the course. A 215-yard dog-leg left, followed by a 215-yard dog-leg right across a saddle between two hills.

Seve, the course's namesake, sets up a thrilling close with a 100-yard approach shot to the 18th green. This hole is a par-4 160 yards from the tee, framed by trees and sand, before the 18th fairway has to open up to play a ball back and beyond one of the course's rough green blocks out. The par-5 18th is a classic finale. And what has about a fairway that dog-legs left and is framed by double trees and approaches that are now open with an incoming left-handing gale.

It's when we're here you can gain a new appreciation for a hole, which hopefully makes club gear with little room for error. You could just

BEST TIME TO GO

Provence attracts plenty of visitors in the peak summer, so plan your Pont Royal visit to catch the May or September shoulder when the weather is at its best and the crowds are fewest.

As well as the golf, Pont Royal has lots to offer including a Provençal-style village, walled town, Miles park, bars, restaurants, and tennis function. About Golf International Pont Royal
The 18-hole course at Pont Royal is the only Severiano Ballesteros-designed course in France.

The club's 37-acre Durance Training Centre - the only one of its kind in the region - is just five minutes from the course and comprises a two-storey driving range, large putting green, a short-game practice area, and a 1,039-yard, six-hole course, featuring five par-three holes and one par-four. It also features a David Leadbetter Academy.

The golf club at Pont Royal is located within the domain of the same name, which also includes a pretty Provençal-style village, wooded areas, lakes, pools, bars, restaurants, and a tourist information office.

Accommodation is offered in the four-star, 102-room Moulin de Vernègues, part of the Châteaux & Hôtels Collection, or in apartments, villas and houses within the pedestrianised Pierre & Vacances village.

Pont Royal is ideally situated in the Commune of Malaussène, between Aix and Avignon, 30 minutes from the TGV stations and the Marseille-Provence and Avignon-Caumont airports, 90 minutes from Montpellier-Méditerranée Airport and a little more than two hours from Nice Airport.

The region is well served for accommodation with excellent, competitively priced hotels and gîtes, while there are six Michelin-starred restaurants within 45 minutes of Pont Royal, and a wide selection of other eateries offering a wonderful variety of regional cuisine, from the Luberon down to the Mediterranean.

Wine is an everyday part of life in Provence and there is a wide variety from which to choose, with Provence Rosé and rich red wines from the Southern Rhône, such as Châteauneuf-du-Pape, all easily accessible.

The region is steeped in history and culture - as well as sunshine. Provence was the first Roman provincia beyond the Alps; 600 years later it was under Spanish rule and was not willed to the king of France until the 16th century - all influenced the region in ways which may still be seen today.

Provence is renowned for its association with some of the world's greatest artists: Paul Cézanne - arguably the most famous resident of Aix-en-Provence, and who has his own 'trail'; Vincent Van Gogh, who moved from Paris to Arles in an effort to cure his manic depression (indeed, it was in this very city that he cut off his ear after fighting with fellow artist Paul Gauguin); Pablo Picasso, a fan of Cézanne, moved to Provence and purchased a 17th-century castle in Vauvenargues; and Henri Matisse resided in Nice for nearly 40 years.

From the world-renowned white horses to the stunning flamingos and impressive black bulls, the Camargue - one of Europe's most cherished wetlands - is a breathtaking reminder of Provence's natural heritage.

Forget the Ryder Cup... It's Provence for me.

It takes something a little out of the ordinary to get me excited these days, such as an alien landing or a president being indicted on criminal charges... but I'm actually looking forward to September.

What has me so enthusiastic that I could suck a sherbet lemon, I don't hear you ask? Well, there's a certain golf event in France in September that I am attending and I'm really looking forward to it. Yes, I know the Ryder Cup's being played at Le Golf National... but that's not it.

No, I'm going to be at the Hopps Open de Provence, a Challenge Tour event, at Golf International Pont Royal, in Provence, from September 20-23.

It's not often my work has taken me to a tour event of any kind. I've worked at a couple of LET tournaments and a Seniors' event, but this will be my first Challenge Tour event. And I can't wait.

Of course, I'd love to be at the Ryder Cup too. And next year's Masters and the Open, but it's unlikely. Even if I was, chances are I wouldn't be allowed the sort of access to players I will enjoy at Pont Royal – which is, incidentally, the only Severiano Ballesteros-designed course in France.

Not for these guys the luxury of a first-class flight back home after missing the cut – it probably means they've lost money on the deal. Many of us may envy the lifestyle of the successful European Tour pro, but to even simply get to that level requires a huge amount of commitment, guts, resilience and not a little money.

For the majority of European Tour pros, everything will have started on a similar journey to this, living out of a suitcase and

sometimes wondering from where the next meal was coming.

It's edge-of-the-seat stuff. A missed putt may mean a decision has to be made on a golfing future. For some, it's not quite as simple as 'try again next week'. And that's why I'm so keen to see them in action.

There's no shortage of talent on show; sometimes it's just one facet of the game that stops these guys teeing it up alongside the likes of Francesco Molinari and Tommy Fleetwood. Some will be taking their first steps in the pro game, while, for others, it may be the last-chance saloon. It can be emotionally raw, heart-breaking and joyous in equal measure.

Yet there's a chance one or two of the competitors will be making decent progress on the European Tour in a few

years – and for me, that's why I'm only too happy to go along and watch such an event. To work at one just tops it off.

This one's in Provence too, which means I also have the joy of beautiful scenery, sunshine and wonderful food and drink, both on and off the course.

If you're heading to the Ryder Cup, you'll have it too... but mine will just be that little bit cheaper. **GM&E**

Golf365 Blog: Even Preparation is a Royal Challenge

France will be the focus of attention for the golfing world in September, but while the big names will be battling it out for continental glory in Paris, Europe's lesser lights will endure their own intense pressure as they look to give themselves a chance of a late Ryder Cup place via the European Tour.

Golf365's Dave Bowers will be writing a series of blogs outlining what goes into hosting and competing in a Challenge Tour event. Here's his first offering...

Preparations are well under way in France, for a tournament that will test competitors' nerves and mental tour of pain in equal measure.

And, while the event takes place in September, we're not looking at the Ryder Cup here. No, we're 480 odd miles south of Le Golf National, at Golf International Port Royal, for the Haagg Open de Provence, on the Challenge Tour.

But if you're looking for a Ryder Cup link, the course on which this event will be played is the only one in France designed by a man whose name is inextricably linked with the growth of the Ryder Cup. Seamus Powerstone. What's more, Seamus' son, Janet, is competing in the event.

The Haagg Open de Provence takes place from September 20-23 - just a little more than a week before the biennial classic in Paris - and for those involved, whether player or club official, the pressure will feel just as great as that at the Ryder Cup.



The Challenge Tour pros are running out of events to secure the necessary points to claim a top-25 place in the Race to Rio. Al Khelaifi is guaranteeing full playing rights to the 2019 European Tour International schedule, while the host club is already stretching every metaphorical fibre to ensure everything is in place and nothing is left to chance, and because they can safely expect around 6,000 fewer fans than at the Europe v USA 'whoop fest', doesn't mean they can lower standards accordingly.

This stripping down to the basics - think EPL Championship to the European Tour's Premier League - is named the Challenge Tour for a reason, as Port Royal's greenkeeping staff have discovered.

Their biggest challenge currently is ensuring the course is well watered as the sun continues to beat down. Greenkeepers are required to win the daily battle to prevent natural intuition of turning everything brown. And, in advance of the tournament, the team is changing - sandtrapping, replacing a bunker - the rough, in both shape and length, and ensuring the recently refined bunkers are of a universal depth and strong yellow colouring.

Additionally, a new bunker has been constructed on the eighth fairway to catch short attempts to pre-empt the substantial dogleg right.



The greens are currently raking at 10 feet and will be up at 13-14 on the diameter by the time the tournament tee off - that's the same surface speed as the Masters, so the Challenge Tour is not for the fast-heeled. And certainly not for your average Sunday hacker like yours truly.

Walking towards that target, which will require the grass to be around three to a half inches, but one with which head greenkeeper, Marlene Chabot, is familiar. He has vast experience of the course at Port Royal, having been part of the team which built it between 1990 and 1992.

He explained: "We have 30 years of experience building the Masters 13, on the European Tour's satellite Alps Tour, so we know what is required to set the course for the Challenge Tour. We have narrowed the fairways, which will be cut to 11m, the 'first cut' will be 25m, and the rough itself, 30m... and, appropriately, quite a challenge."

"Also, the undergrowth has been cleared through the wooded areas, while the lower branches of trees near the fairway have been cut to allow us who drive off to be able to clear a shot - just like here, who was the master of mowers. Oh, and the tee boxes will also be cut to three, the same as the greens!"

Golf's all about hitting a ball, with a hole, into a hole...

About Golf International Pont Royal

The 18-hole course at Pont Royal is the only Seve Ballesteros-designed course in France.

The club's 37-acre Durance Training Centre - the only one of its kind in the region - is just five minutes from the course and comprises a two-storey driving range, large putting green, a short-game practice area, and a 1,039-yard, six-hole course, featuring five par-three holes and one par-four. It also features a David Leadbetter Academy.

From the world-renowned white horses to the stunning flamingos and impressive black bulls, the Camargue - one of Europe's most cherished wetlands - is a breathtaking reminder of Provence's natural heritage.
